

KEY TO READING THE DESCRIPTION OF MANUSCRIPTS

Sigla:

They are the new *sigla* assigned to the MSS in this catalog, which will be used by the members of the Research Project in their work of editing and textual commentary. **Blue** indicates a manuscript or fragment and **Red** indicates an *excerptum*.

FECHA/DATE:

It is the date attributed to the MSS in the various catalogs or editions. This section is still under development.

NOMBRE/NAME:

The name in green indicates that a copy of a MS is located at the University of Huelva (UHU), in any of the media that the entities often use supplying copies of the MSS (microfilm, digital, paper). The name in black indicates that a copy of a MS has not yet received in UHU.

"Rub. #" expresses the number allocated to the MSS in the catalog produced by Rubio, L., *Catálogo de los manuscritos clásicos latinos existentes en España*, Madrid 1984.

"Estév." states that it is a further testimony found by Estévez Sola, J. A., which will appear in his paper, "New manuscript witnesses of Ovid's *Metamorphoses*", in the press; the number will be added once the work is published.

DESCRIPTION:

- Physical description: ff.: Pages / mm.: size / ll.: Lines
- *met.* indicates that the work is complete, except when the lines are added; gaps are indicated in *green*; (margin.): glosses or marginal notes; (gloss.): glosses; (interl.): interlinear glosses or annotations.

The following abbreviations are used for the works of Ovid: *her.*, *epistula Sapphus (epla. Sapph.)*, *am.*, *ars*, *rem.*, *met.*, *med.*, *fast.*, *trist.*, *Pont.*, *Ibis/in Ibin*, *cons.*, *de nuce/nux, de philomel/na/philomel/na* (in red, *met.*; in orange, *her.*; in blue, *pseudoovidiana*); we also sometimes mention the following works attributed to Ovid: *pul./de pulice*, *de pediculo*, *de luco*, *de cuculo*, *de vetula*, *de med. aurium*, *de mirabilibus mundi*, *de humoribus*.

We use Munari references for the "metrical suscriptions often recurring in the MSS", which are the following:
